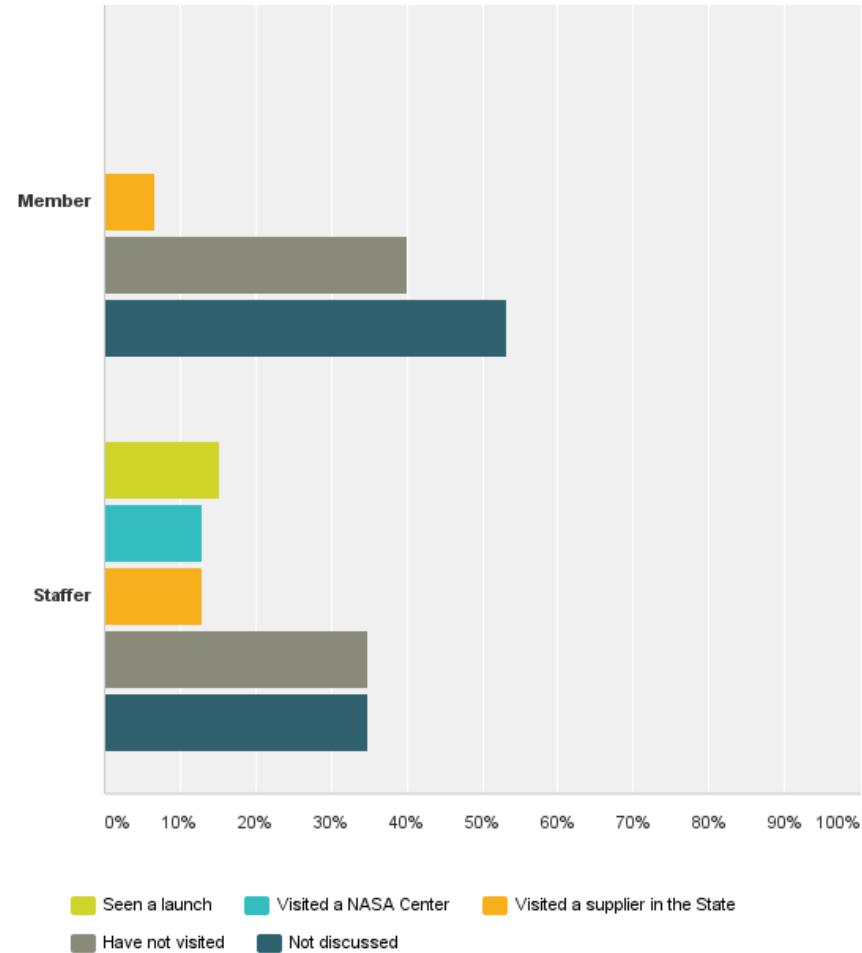
56 Office Visits

How engaged were they during the discussion?

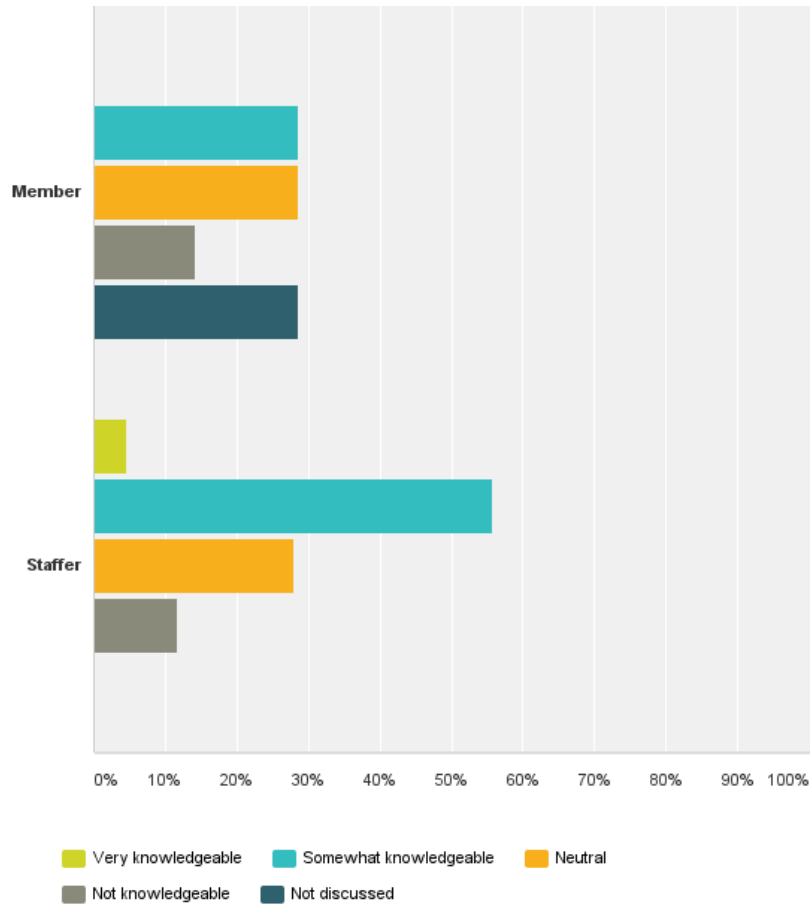


Have They Ever...?



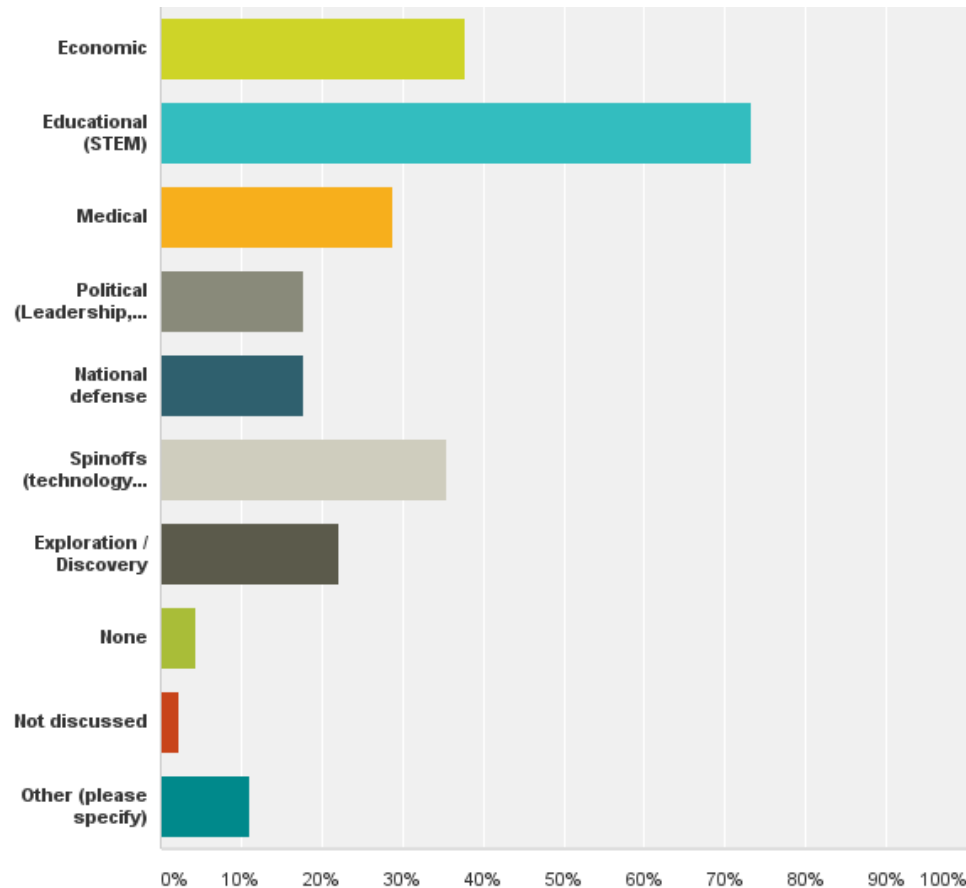


How aware was the office of NASA's human spaceflight programs



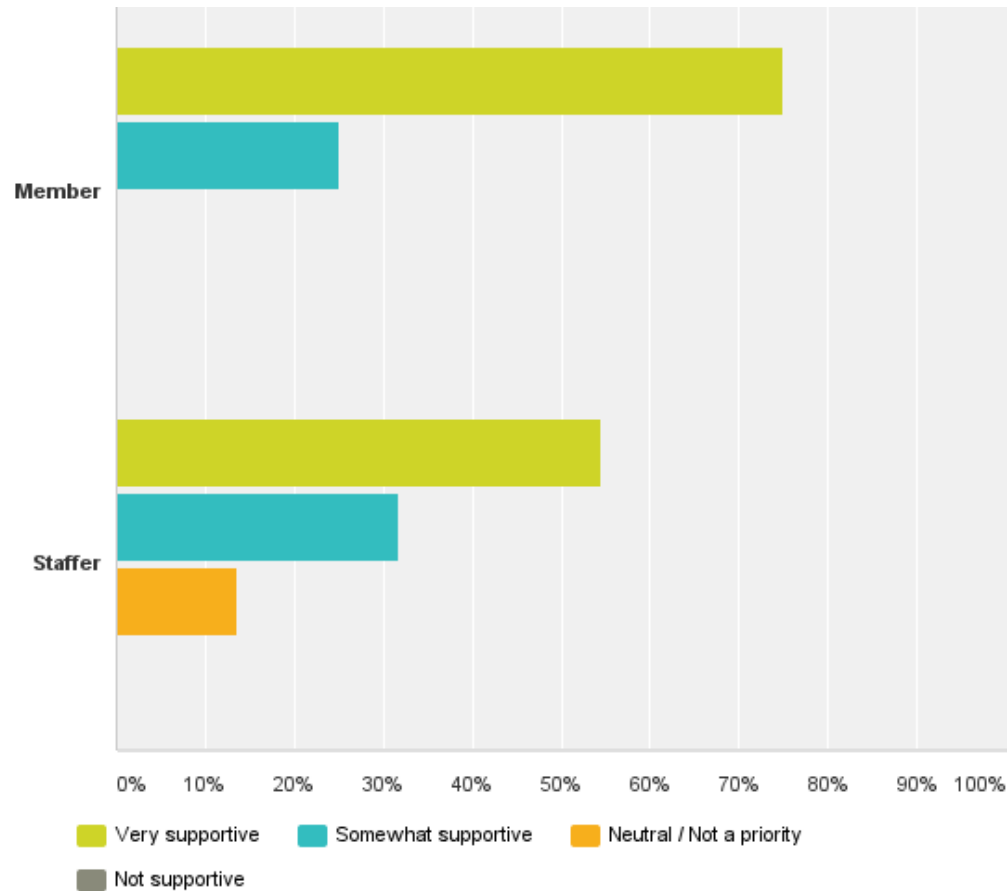


Did they mention any specific benefits? Or were there any that resonated particularly well?



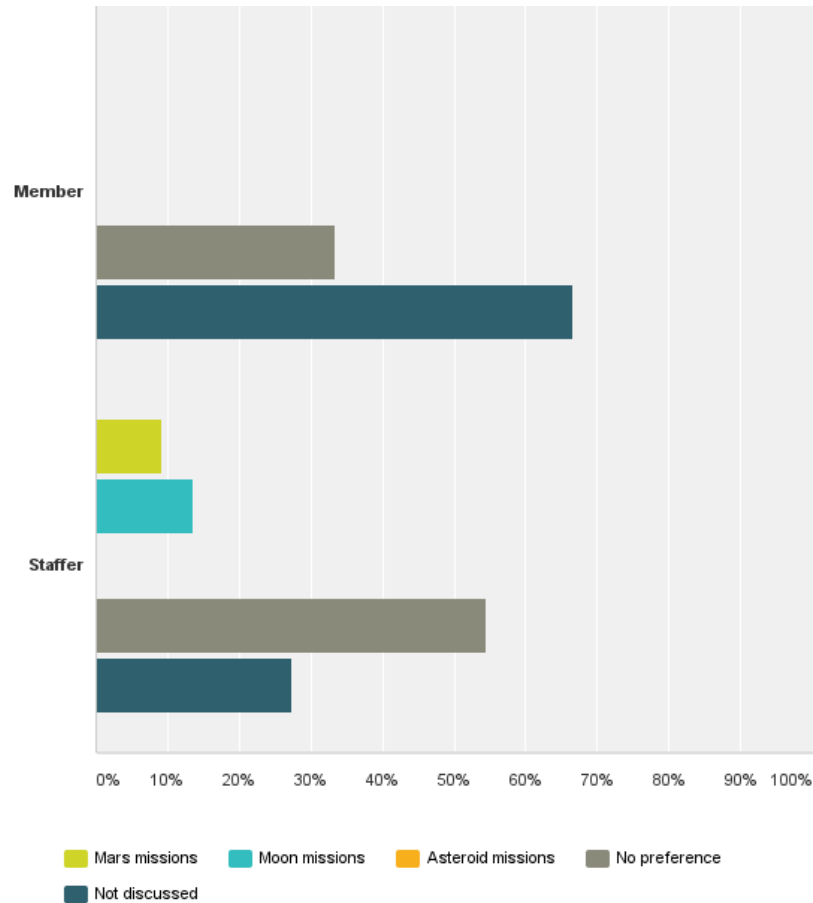


What is their level of support for Human Space Exploration?



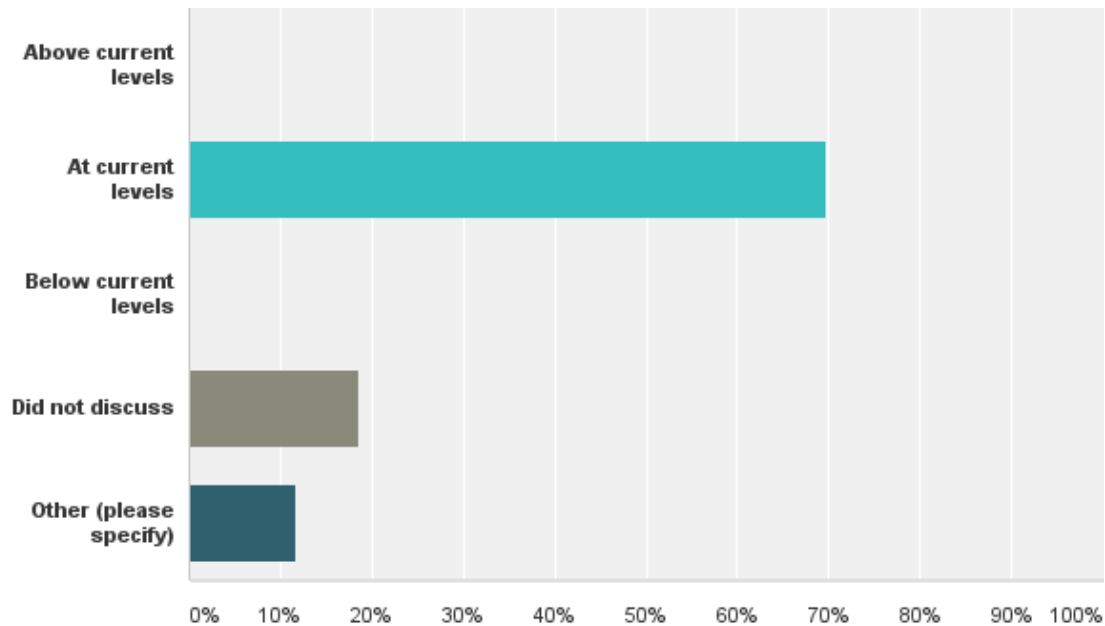


Did they indicate a preference to a destination for human exploration? If so, which destination(s)?
