


- 31st Annual Trip



Survey Data Highlights



- 57% of House member offices were visited and 59% of Senate offices.
- 79% were "very engaged" in the meeting.
- 91 staffers had visited a NASA center.
- 85% were "very knowledgeable" or "somewhat knowledgeable" about NASA's exploration programs.
- 86% of staffers were "very knowledgeable" or "somewhat knowledgeable" about the benefits derived from the space program
 - Education was mentioned in 83% of meetings
 - Economic benefits in 66%
 - Leadership in 47%
 - National defense in 42%
 - Spinoffs in 37%
 - Exploration/discovery in 31%.
- 75% of visits were considered "highly supportive" and 19% "moderately supportive" of human space exploration.
- Specific concerns focused on the debt ceiling discussions and their potential impact on the NASA budget.








Was the Member or Staffer engaged in the discussion?








How aware of the HSF portfolio?








How aware of the benefits from the space program?








Benefits that resonated well?








Member's overall level of support?
